Biscuits by Grace Gookin

Sift two cups Clifton Mills unbleached white bolted wheat flour with $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. salt, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. of Royal baking powder (from the Broadway Market in Detroit). Cut $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of butter into these dry ingredients with a pastry blender until of the consistency of coarse corn meal. Stir in gradually $\frac{3}{4}$ cup milk.

Drop by large tablespoonful onto a buttered baking pan. Bake at 425 degrees for 15-20 minutes depending on size of biscuit.
